WEARING A MASK IS MANDATORY OUTDOOR IN A HUNDRED OF COUNTIES IN FRANCE

DUE TO EMERGENCE OF POSITIVE CASES COVID

USPA NEWS - In France, wearing a face mask to protect oneself and others against two COVID-19, outdoors is now mandatory in a hundred municipalities, and this since the beginning of August, due to the resurgence of cases tested positive for COVID-19. The largest cluster being Mayenne, wearing a mask has become compulsory in ALL public places. We are publishing the list of LCI News Broadcast (TF1 Group subsidiary) in the municipalities concerned after wearing the compulsory mask, since the beginning of August, concerning growths of the emergence of positive cases, infected by COVID-19.

THE MANDATORY WEARING OF A MASK ON THE EXTERIOR IS GIVEN INTO A HUNDRED OF COUNTIES IN FRANCE

Wearing a mask became mandatory in cities in France outside, due to signals of resumption of the COVID-19 epidemic, health measures are tightening up everywhere in France, in particular concerning the protective mask since July 20. And, since the beginning of August, municipal or prefectural decrees have been issued in thousands of towns, large and small, to impose the wearing of masks outside. Thus, several cities in France have made it compulsory in their busiest streets: Paris, Ile-de-France, Seine et Marne, Montpellier, Lyon, Nantes, Bordeaux, Marseille, Toulouse, Biarritz, Nice, Perpignan, Creil, Argelès, Ile-de-Ré, Belfort, Saint-Etienne ...

LIST OF TOWNS AND COUNTIES WHERE THE WEARING OF A MASK IS MANDATORY OUTSIDE

- Amiens (Somme): the mask is mandatory in areas where there is a high concentration of population, since August 7. These are the pedestrian streets of the city center from Monday 2 p.m. to 7 p.m. and Tuesday to Saturday from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., the Saint Leu district and part of Saint-Germain les Halles, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays, 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- Annecy (Haute-Savoie): wearing a mask is compulsory in the pedestrian zone of the old town where the streets are "cramped" from Tuesday 4 August.
- Argelès-sur-mer (Pyrénées-Orientales): the mask is compulsory in the pedestrian walkways and in the markets until August 31.
- Barcarès (Pyrénées Orientales): the mayor of the town issued a prefectural decree. taking effect on August 3, which makes it compulsory to wear "nasal and oral" protection in public places in the city. This concerns the Place du Tertre, the Place de la République, the Place de la Coudalère as well as the Lydia site and all the non-covered markets.
- Bayonne (Pyrénées-Atlantiques): in the city center from Monday 3 August.
- Biarritz (Pyrénées-Atlantiques): in very busy areas from Monday 3 August.
- Biscarosse (Landes): a decree establishes the obligation to wear a mask for anyone aged 11 and over on avenue de la Plage, between rue du Touring club and boulevard des Sables.
- Bourges (Cher): wearing a mask is compulsory in the hyper center area from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., from Wednesday 5 August 2020
- Chamonix (Haute-Savoie): wearing a mask has become compulsory in pedestrian areas, the Montanvers square, the Mont-Blanc square on market days, the rue des Moulins, the rue du Docteur Paccard, the rue Joseph Vallot, the quays of Arve, avenue Michel Croz, avenue de l'Aiguille du Midi, the forecourt of the Aiguille du Midi, avenue Ravel le Rouge, as well as any public space welcoming flea markets and garage sales.
- Concarneau (Finistère): wearing a mask is compulsory in all the streets of the walled city, on the ramparts, the Petit Château, the Place St-Guénolé and the Carré des Larrons from 10 am to 10 pm.
- Honfleur (Calvados): since a decree of July 30, wearing a mask is compulsory in the old port sector, the streets and shopping places of the hyper-center, all food and non-food markets, flea markets and garage sales, the parks and gardens of the city center, the west pier, the beach and the car parks.
- La Rochelle (Charente-Maritime): in the streets of the Old Port and the hypercentre, since July 22.
- Le Grau-du-Roi (Gard): in the pedestrian streets since July 18.
- Le Touquet (Pas-de-Calais): in the city center from this Saturday August 1st.
- Lille (North): certain areas of the European metropolis of Lille, from Monday 3 August.
- Nice (Alpes-Maritimes): "In some streets of the city", from Monday August 3, according to the announcement posted on Twitter by the mayor Christian Estrosi.
- Noirmoutier-en-l'Île (Vendée): in markets, flea markets and garage sales as well as on Grande rue, rue du Rosaire, and the

esplanade of Plage des Dames, since July 17.

- Orléans (Loiret): on the banks of the Loire, in the evening and at night (from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m.), and on all flea markets and garage sales, since Friday July 31.
- Perros-Guirec (Côtes d'Armor): the "coastal and commercial" sectors from 10 am to 7 pm, since Friday July 31. Note that the obligation was already valid for the markets.
- Quiberon (Morbihan): on several busy roads in the city since July 24.
- Quimper (Finistère): wearing a mask is compulsory from August 4 in "all pedestrian areas in the city center" from 9 am to 7 pm.
- Saint-Brieuc (Côte d'Armor): in the city center and during any event or event bringing together more than 10 people, since July 20.
- Saint-Malo (Ille-et-Villaine): in the inner city and on the ramparts since Thursday, July 30.
- Saint-Tropez (Var): on a large perimeter of the town, including the port, the town center and the old town. This measure takes effect from Friday August 7 at midnight for a period of one month and is imposed on anyone over the age of 11.
- Toulouse (Haute-Garonne): the mayor of the city, Jean-Luc Moudenc announced that the wearing of the mask would be compulsory from Wednesday August 5, quai and place St. Pierre, quai Lucien Lombard, quai and place de la Sea bream and Henri-Martin walk from 12 p.m. to 3 a.m.
- Tours (Indre-et-Loire): from August 7, the prefecture makes the mask compulsory between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m. in an area including Vieux-Tours or the banks of the Loire.

MANDATORY MASKS IN THE MARKETS-----

- Amiens (Somme): on the Gorkitz market, Etouvie market, Maurice Vast market, Esplanade Branly market, Dargent street market, Colvert market, Parmentier market place, Alphonse Fiquet book market, since August 7.
- Albertville (Savoie): on all foreign markets
- Anglet (Pyrénées-Atlantiques): in all open-air, flea markets, flea markets and garage sales from July 31.
- Annecy (Haute-Savoie): in all markets, since July 25.
- Bayeux (Calvados): on the markets from this Saturday August 1st.
- Biscarosse (Landes): a decree establishes the obligation to wear a mask on the markets on Fridays from 6 a.m. to 3 p.m. and on Sundays from 6 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- Brest (Finistère): on all the outdoor markets
- Caen (Calvados): on all the open-air markets
- Canet-en-Rousillon (Pyrénées-Orientales): in all non-covered markets.
- Cannes (Alpes-Maritimes): the mask is compulsory on municipal markets.
- Gergy (Val-d'Oise): on the markets since Wednesday July 29.
- Dax (Landes): on the markets from this Saturday August 1st.
- Deauville (Calvados): on all foreign markets
- Epinal (Vosges): on all open-air markets
- Ermont (Val-d'Oise): at the Saint-Flaive market (and immediate surroundings), since Wednesday July 29.
- Evian (Haute-Savoie): on all markets not covered
- Lorient (Morbihan): on all non-covered markets
- Noirmoutier (Vendée): in markets, flea markets and garage sales as well as on Grande rue, rue du Rosaire, and the esplanade of the Plage des Dames, since July 17.
- Quimper (Finistère): on all the outdoor markets
- Saint-Brieuc (Côte d'Armor): during any event or event bringing together more than 10 people and in the city center, since July 20.
- Thonon-les-Bains (Haute-Savoie): on all non-covered markets
- Toulouse (Haute-Garonne): the mayor of the city, Jean-Luc Moudenc has announced that wearing a mask will be compulsory in all "markets / flea markets / empty attics" from Wednesday 5 August.

MANDATORY MASK IN ALL PUBLIC PLACES IN BIGGEST CLUSTER MAYENNE

- In Mayenne: in 69 communes of the department, "in all public places (public roads, public outdoor spaces) within the perimeter delimited by the entry and exit signs of the towns concerned", indicated the prefecture Saturday August 1st. These include the municipalities of Laval Agglomeration, the community of municipalities of the Pays de Châteaux-Gontier, the community of municipalities of Ernée as well as the municipalities of Mayenne, Evron, Craon and Renazé, sectors more particularly affected by the virus.
 - Le Mont-Saint-Michel (Manche): in the streets from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., since July 22.
- Mask compulsory in the parks
- Troyes (Aube): in parks and gardens, since July 21.
